Guidelines for Authors

Articles should be written in English or Spanish and submitted in *.doc or *.rtf file. The preferred font is Times New Roman, 12. Each article must be accompanied by a title, affiliation, address, and email addresses of the author(s), an abstract of 300 words or fewer in English and Spanish, and Keywords (up to 7). The text should be divided into sections and paragraphs, and headings must be ranked.

We strongly recommend that all authors have their texts corrected by native English or Spanish speakers before they are submitted.

References cited:

The Reference list should contain only the references that appear in the text and all the references that appear in the text should be cited in References. Please do not abbreviate the names of authors, journals, books, publishers, etc. The references in the text should appear in chronological order however the Reference list should be arranged in alphabetical order.

A separate list of the table titles should be provided. All tables should be numbered in

sequence and cited in the text (Table 1, Table 2).
